## **AMERICANISM/PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR**

If you had the opportunity to attend Mid-Winter Conference in Austin in January and observed the simple ceremony for the Prisoners of War and those Missing in Action, you came away with tears of sadness that we still have men and woman who have never been brought home from the war. The origins of POW/MIA issue dates back to during the war itself. As of November 2019, more than 82,000 missing and unaccounted for Americans exists. There is no concrete evidence today that any Americans are alive today as prisoners of war.

In 1972, the POW/MIA flag was officially recognized by the United States Congress “as the symbol of our Nation’s concern and commitment to resolving as fully as possible the fates of Americans still prisoners, missing and unaccounted for in Southeast Asia, thus ending the uncertainty for their families and the Nation.”

The POW/MIA flag is black and bears in the center, a black and white emblem. Inside the white disk bearing a white silhouette the bust of a man, watch tower with a guard on patrol, and a strand of barb wire. Above the disk are the white letters POW and MIA framing a white 5-pointed star. Below the disk is a black and white wreath above the white motto with the words “You are Not Forgotten.” Beyond Southeast Asia, this flag has been a symbol for POWs/MIAs from all US wars.

On the third Friday in September, known as POW/MIA Recognition Day, we honor the commitments and the sacrifices made by our nation's prisoners of war and those who are still missing in action. POWs and MIAs can be recognized at any time of the year and should be. The POW/MIA Remembrance ceremony or the Missing Man Table brings attention and remembrance to these special veterans and we will never forget the sacrifices they have made for our country, neither will we ever forget them.

The explanation of the Missing Man Table is as follows so Auxiliaries can educate the public and Auxiliary members of the special meaning the table holds.

The table is small with the setting for one person, reflecting the vulnerability of one prisoner against his enemy. The table is round to show that our concern for them is never-ending. There is a white tablecloth on the table that symbolizes the purity of their response to our country's call to arms. The empty chair depicts an unknown face, representing no specific Soldier, Sailor, Airman or Marine, but all who are not here with us. There is a single red rose in a vase that indicates the remainder of the lives of each of the missing and their loved ones who kept their faith, still waiting for answers. It reminds us of their families and loved ones. The red ribbon around the vase represents the love of our country, which inspired them to answer the nation's call. The lit candle stands for the "Candle of Hope". It stands for the everlasting hope for a joyous reunion with those yet accounted for. The Bible represents faith in a higher power and the pledge to our country, founded as one nation under God. The slice of lemon on the bread plate reminds us of their bitter faith. The salt upon the bread plate represents the tears of the families. The inverted wine glass reminds us that our distinguished comrades cannot be with us to drink a toast or join in the festivities of the evening. Always, remember our POW's and MIAs veterans. They have always remembered us and we will not forget them.

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**\*\*\*\*\*SECRETARY NOTES\*\*\*\*\***

**IMPORTANT!!!!** It is almost time for Delegates— DO you want a vote in your District, Department and National levels? Start planning NOW! DISTRICT--- Have you paid all dues to District? Please read section 303 Auxiliary Delegates. You MUST elect at a regular meeting of the Auxiliary held not less than 30 (thirty) calendar days prior to the District Convention at which District officers are to be elected.

1 Delegate and 1 alternate for each 15 members or fraction thereof in good standing in the Auxiliary at the time of the election of Delegates. The Auxiliary Secretary SHALL send the names of the Delegates and the alternates to the District Secretary prior to the District Convention.

What this all means is look at the DATE of your District Convention and ensure that you back up 30 days to the month that you may need to elect District delegates. You may have to vote in FEBRUARY if your convention is in April. Do not be caught without a vote!

**NOTE 2!!!** District delegates are NOT the same as DEPARTMENT DELEGATES. I will be sending out DEPT Delegate strength and dept dues amount after March 1<sup>st</sup>. Your number of delegates will be different than for District delegates. Should you have any questions please feel free to contact headquarters. We are here to assist you!

**EMAIL** — Do you want to receive *Our Two Cents* on email? You may also get other flyers for events that apply to all auxiliary members throughout the year. But you will not be spammed.

**AUDITS!!!**—When completing an audit there cannot be any NEGATIVE balance on a line item. Should you find there is a negative you must move the funds from General fund to that line item. Do not spend money in DUES that you have not already received. If you are paying for a member's dues by vote of the auxiliary then it comes from General fund or from Relief Fund depending on the circumstances.
