

This month I'd like to explain some information about "Taps". The 24 notes of this melody strikes deeply in our emotions when it is played. There is not a time when a tear is not sliding down my cheek when "Taps" is played. The origin of the word "Taps" is thought to have come from the Dutch word "Tattoo -"Tap-toe".

Taps comes from three drum taps that were beat as a signal for "Extinguish Lights" when a bugle was not used. This distinctive melody is played at United States military funerals and memorials and as a lights out to soldiers at night during the American Civil War, in July 1862.

General Daniel Butterfield created "Taps" to be used as a signal to the end of the day and honoring his troops who had perished. Taps today is still sounded at military funerals, memorial services, and wreath laying ceremonies.

At some military bases, Taps is played as the last call in the evening. Taps is performed by a solo bugler without accompaniment or embellishment either with a bugle or a trumpet.

In 2012, Congress recognized "Taps" as the National Song of Remembrance". When Taps is played during military funerals, military members will render a salute from the beginning until the conclusion of the song. Civilians should place their right hand over their heart during this time. All attendees should stand at attention, if able.

It is so beautiful how Oliver Wilcox Norton explains Taps, "There is something singularly beautiful and appropriate in the music of this wonderful call."

It's strains are melancholy, yet full of rest and peace. It's echoes linger in the heart long after its tones have ceased to vibrate in the air."

Thank you, Madam President, for giving me the opportunity to be your Americanism/ Patriotic Instructor this year.

I thoroughly enjoyed the ride on this great journey serving our veterans and will always be a **Voice For Our Veterans - Not An Echo** and will **Serve Our Veterans with Aloha** with open arms and warm hearts.

Our first-place Department winner will be submitted to National for the opportunity to compete for National awards totaling \$31,000! All other entries may be picked up in June at

Department Convention in Austin. Each Auxiliary member retrieving art will be required to sign a ‘Release of Art’ form before leaving. Good luck to everyone!

Another deadline passed on March 31st for “Scholarship Award for Auxiliaries, No.1” entry forms to be submitted. This is an opportunity for each Auxiliary who promoted the Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest to show National what we are doing to promote our Auxiliary scholarship. The Department first-place winner will be submitted for the opportunity to win a National award for “Best Promotion of...” at our National Convention in Reno, NV, in July.
